

FULL MEMBERS PRESENTATION PROTOCOL

The presentation is to be of 30 minutes to 45 minutes duration.

The basis of the presentation is to provide approximately three cases highlighting both clinical and laboratory work.

All cases should provide a diagnosis based on the clinical examination and investigations and a plan of treatment must be provided.

The plan of treatment should include alternative treatment options that could have been utilised for the particular case and information provided on why one option was chosen over other options.

The treatment of the cases should be detailed and should include a step-by-step account of the sequence of treatment with clear and accurate photographs.

The final outcome must be shown clearly and should include a retrospective analysis of the treatment identifying any weaknesses or what could have been done differently.

All treatment decisions should be backed by literature references. The onus is on the applying associate member to understand all the references quoted and be fully prepared for the question and answer session, which follows their presentation for 10-15 minutes.

The list below provides a guideline on the format as well as the inclusion of relevant data for all presentations. Not all the data provided will be required in any one case presentation.

Relevant patient details, such as age, sex and relevant Medical History.

Chief complaint, or dental problem requiring treatment.

Clinical examination and outcome.

Intraoral and extraoral examination

TMJ and occlusal analysis

Outcome of examination current status and diagnosis.

Additional investigations

Radiographic examination

Mounted study casts

Any other relevant investigations and any outcomes of significance.

Initial treatment

Removal of pathology

Diagnostic treatment such as provisional restorations

Establishing Oral hygiene health and status.

Details of treatment and sequence of treatment

Surgical treatment :

- periodontal surgery
- surgical extractions
- surgical endodontic
- Augmentation
- implant placement
- Soft tissue surgery

Non-surgical treatment :

- endodontics
- orthodontics
- bleaching etc

Definitive treatment

Restorative phase

- Impressions

- registration
- Metal try-in
- porcelain try-in
- fitting of definitive restoration
- final occlusal analysis

Maintenance and monitoring protocol

- radiographs
- clinical examination
- hygienist appointment sequence
- occlusal splint.
